"Younger golfers (under 40's) and 'new to golf' golfers (women, men and children) play more when you remove all the red tape (rules) associated with golf courses, and guess what, they still respect the golf course and their fellow golfers alike," GreenSpace Management Managing Director Peter Vlahandreas said.

"It's a no 'BS' approach to playing golf, people want to just play golf, that's it, they aren't bothered with tradition, rules and competitions in public access golf.

"Public golf courses are not pseudo 'private golf courses', they

are certainly not 'championship' golf, and they are definitely not stuffy and unwelcoming. Public golf courses are just that, public access recreation – all are welcome, they are not reserved for member groups who dominate peak utilisation times, they are not for a select few, they are public access sport for everyone in the community."

Apart from the enjoyable nine-hole Par-3 golf course, there is a full-length driving range with eight undercover Trackman range bays, ten synthetic bays and four grass bays. Also, SHANX Mini Golf @ Little Para is launching shortly.
